Dear Parents and Carers,



This week is Anti-Bullying week across the country and our children have been engaging in learning and discussion about this, following the Anti-Bullying Alliance's theme for 2023 of "Make a Noise about Bullying". It is the unfortunate truth that negative behaviours and attitudes happen in all aspects and ages of life, and giving our children the opportunity to learn about and discuss how our behaviour affects others, what it is like to be on the receiving end of persistent negative behaviour, and help them to understand the effects that this has on people's mental health is really important. Understanding this issue is key to preventing it from happening, but also for having the right strategies to deal with situations if they arise for yourself or for others. The discussions the children have in their classes, and the work they do in their PSRHE lessons particularly on developing positive relationships and E-safety is all part of the bigger, ongoing education of the children around the message of anti-bullying.

Our school council team has played an important role in this topic, being involved in assembly on Monday promoting their competition to design an 'Anti-Bullying Hero'. They will be judging the entries today and we will be sharing the winners next week. Our chosen Anti-Bullying heroes will then be used as characters on information posters the councillors will produce for our classrooms.

Tackling bullying involves working closely and in partnership with families. The Anti-Bullying Alliance has teamed up with Kidscape (the charity we invited in to hold an E-Safety parent workshop last year) to produce a parent's guide to tackling bullying. I couldn't put this any better than they do on their website when they say:

"As a parent or carer, you are a vital piece of the puzzle in tackling bullying. You have a unique role to play in guiding and supporting your child through their school years and there are many positive steps you can take to help keep your child safe from bullying and harm. One of the steps is knowing when to ask for support. At the end of this resource, we have included details of organisations like Kidscape that can help."

This tool was written with input from Kidscape and is designed to give you information about bullying, tips about what to do if you're worried about bullying, and provide the tools to help you talk to your children about bullying."

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


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Reminder
